- respect and value different cultures and beliefs
- enjoy regular contact with students and adults living in different countries.

## Objectives

- To work towards achieving and maintaining the International School Award.
- To conduct an annual audit of the curriculum in order to develop each of the eight Key Concepts of the Global Dimension throughout all appropriate areas of the curriculum. These eight concepts we recognise as:
  1. diversity
  2. conflict resolution
  3. global citizenship
  4. human rights
  5. interdependence
  6. social justice
  7. sustainable development
  8. values and perceptions
- To develop a variety of *global learning partnerships*. This will include activities such as:
  - } e mail and internet projects/exchange of work
  - } interacting with visitors from other countries (students and staff)
  - } student/staff visits to places of cultural interest in the UK and abroad
  - } staff/student exchanges
- To actively encourage the study of a foreign language for all students by teaching all of the children French, as well as keeping up the Spanish, already learnt
