Subject: Geography – Brazil Year: KS1 - Year B – Summer

Human and physical geography

- identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the United Kingdom
- use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to:
- key **physical** features, including: beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river, soil, valley, vegetation, season and weather
- key **human** features, including: city, town, village, factory, farm, house, office, port, harbour and shop **Geographical skills and fieldwork**
- use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries
- use simple compass directions (North, South, East and West) and locational and directional language [for example, near and far; left and right], to describe the location of features and routes on a map
- use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features; devise a simple map; and use and construct basic symbols in a key
- use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of their school and its grounds and the key human and physical features of its surrounding environment.

Prior Learning (what pupils already know and can do)

Year 2 children will know the continent of South America and will be able to identify the continent on a world map. Year 2 children will know that the Amazon river and rainforest are in Brazil.

End Points (what pupils MUST know and remember)

Know the key similarities and differences between Warrington in England and Manaus in Brazil.

Key Vocabulary

Session 1:

Where is Brazil?

Using a range of maps identify where Brazil is in the world. Emphasise the locational and place knowledge.

Vocabulary: Country, continent, equator, location, ocean

Session 2:

What is Manaus like?

Using a Google Earth zoom in on Manaus, a city in Brazil within the Amazon rainforest. Focus on the area where you find the school – International School of Amazona. Using street view, Google Earth and a range of maps look at the physical and human geography of the area.

Vocabulary: continent, country, city, urban, rural, river, rainforest, school, house, port, factory, farm, vegetation, weather, season
